Everyone is invited to come in and look around and select any book that may be of interest to them.

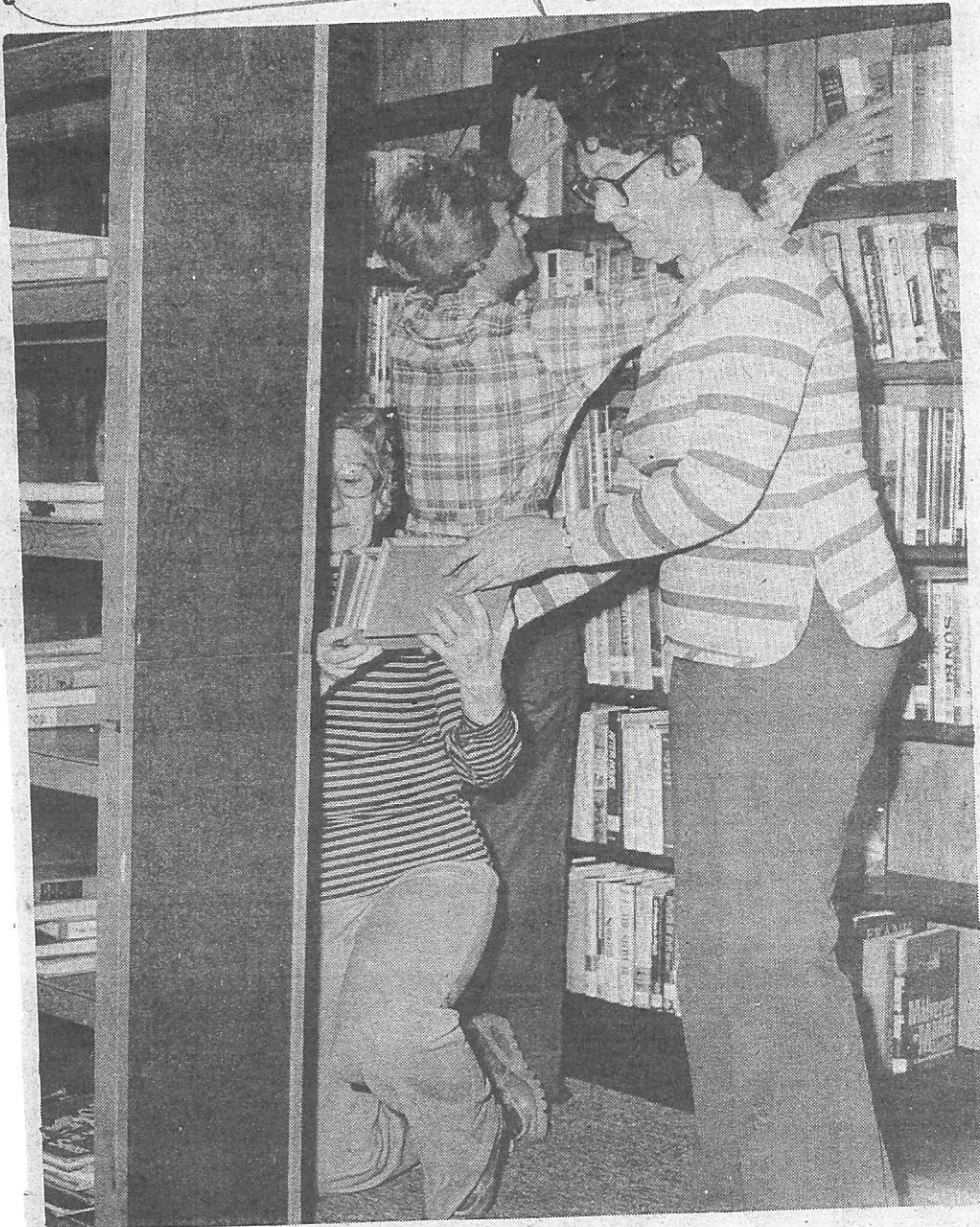
